A \$3 million dollar fundraising effort started with a committee and a \$5 donation! Hal saw a need that he knew his beloved Kinsmen and Kinettes could absolutely fulfill!! He did not doubt, but boldly moved forward with passion and compassion to provide milk for children in the midst of war, and he JUST DID IT!!

And we can do it too!! What Hal must have felt as he took on this seemingly impossible task at the time. He did not know where the funds would come from. The book comments that, "The...members geared up for war as if marching into battle." (p. 18)

At times this year will seem like a battle. I am not going to lie to any of us. At times we will have to also put off our "frivolity" til later. It will seem at times this year that it is a series of work sessions with "shirtsleeves rolled high." But when we look back on this year, this first year of our new club with us as the pioneers who were brave enough to forge ahead to establish a club that will make a real difference in our community for generations to come, we will know it was well worth it!! I believe it is worth it!!

It is worth it for us to believe in this club. It is important for us to believe in each other. As Kinettes we are apart of a heritage we can absolutely be proud to be apart of. 

# You can help those without a voice January quill Submitted by Terry Baldwin

As 2014 unfolds and we all shake off the holiday haze, put away the decorations and put down the holiday goodies, you probably have your personal list of goals and resolutions set and intend to make it a great year! If you're still looking for ways to make changes in your life, help your community or try something new, I can help by talking about a subject that is dear to my heart and sometimes overlooked in the volunteer organizations and charitable causes.

At this time of year when the winter weather can be unforgiving, it's comforting to know that most of us can curl up with out cat under a favourite blanket and start the novel that you've been meaning to read or snuggle with your dog by the fireplace. Unfortunately, this is a very difficult time for homeless animals and unwanted pets, as the shelters and adoption centres are overrun with rescued animals in from the cold and some do not make it to shelters in time, which is a tragedy.

Charities come in all kinds of shapes and sizes. Charity Intelligence Canada offer insight into the way charities use donations to further their causes. Categories include at-risk youth, homeless people, education, health, women's issues, helping children, and animal welfare. The Canada Revenue Agency list 839 charities under the search heading of "Protection of Animals".

Animal-based charitable organizations can raise money for the protection of endangered species, wild animal welfare, veterinary research to improve the health of animals, and the protection of dogs and cats in your local neighbourhoods. Look at a group's mission statement and ultimate goals to ensure that they are ethical and their values align with your own. If you can contribute with a financial donation, how much of your money is going directly to the animals, how much is going to administration and fundraising? The British Columbia SPCA (Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals) and the Nova Scotia SPCA both report over 70% of donated funds go toward their animal operations. These charities have

been named in Money Sense magazine as two of the top-rated charitable organizations in Canada.

You may choose to donate to a local dog recue or



feral cat organization when looking for a favourite animal cause. These smaller groups are largely volunteer-run and rely on the big hearts of their neighbours and veterinarians to help individual animals in their communities. These people help to relieve the stress on crowded humane societies and municipal animal services by fostering stray or abandoned cats and dogs or providing transportation of feral cats to veterinary hospitals for neutering before the cats are released back into the community. Spay and neuter programs and those promoting responsible pet ownership are immensely important in minimizing stray and feral populations in urban and suburban areas.

Many people would rather actively volunteer for their favourite animal cause instead of offering financial donations. Exercising dogs, cleaning litter boxes, and grooming newly rescued animals can be very satisfying work for people from all walks of life. Your favourite humane society or rescue shelter may have a training process that teaches volunteers how to approach and work with fearful or abused animals. Time management, compassion and patience become highly valuable skills in a shelter environment. Think about the kitten who poops in the litter box as soon as you place a fresh tray in her kennel-after you have finished washing and refreshing 25 litter boxes! Possessing a good sense of humor (don't forget a good set of dishwashing gloves) is also very helpful when working with these dogs and cats.

The Canadian Kennel Club (CKC) is a group of dog breeders who come together with the sole purpose of raising high quality dogs that best reflect a breed in terms of physical characteristics, temperament and working instincts. CKC members hold over 3,000 events each year. Run largely by dedicated volunteers the CKC looks for dedicated people to help with conformation and handling classes, obedience and tracking training and to mentor new breeders within the specific breed clubs. Folks looking for a purebred pup or new dog owners will find the most current information about raising a particular breed to the best of their ability from these people. Both the CKC and other like minded organizations also work diligently to communicate the need for responsible dog ownership across the country. The Canadian Cat Association (CCA) and the Internation Cat Association (TICA) offer similar programs for cats. Cat breeders not only promote their certain breed, they also concerned with overall health and wellness in their communities. For more information, check out the CCA at www. ccaafe.com

Another fantastic organization is the Furever's Foster Program. Their aim is to help rescue groups reduce the number of dogs euthanized by placing homeless dogs into temporary foster care until new, permanent homes can be found. Education and outreach is a large part of the answer. Dog rescue volunteers are working hard to decrease the number of dogs euthanized every year because they have been abandoned, neglected or surrendered and end up homeless. Together we can move Kin forward, together we are makin' a difference.



#### Blueberry Triffle Recipe submitted by Brittany Galenkamp

#### Ingredients:

- 2 cups fresh blueberries, rinsed and dried, divided (I used frozen)
- 1/4 cup granulated sugar or sweetener, divided (I used Splenda)
- 1 ½ tsp cornstarch
- 1 lemon, scrubbed well and dried
- 4 oz light cream cheese, at room temperature or half of a regular package
- 2 tbsp frozen orange juice concentrate, thawed (I just used frozen, unwrapped the container then threw it back into the freezer covered when I was finished with it)
- 3/4 cup non-fat or low fat plain yogurt (I used non-fat vanilla)

Half 10 oz angel food cake, cut into ½ inch cubes (I used a boxed mix)

#### Instructions:

- 1. Combine  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup blueberries, 2 tbsp sugar, the cornstarch, and  $\frac{3}{4}$  cup water in a small saucepan. Stir until the cornstarch has dissolved.
- 2. Bring to a boil over medium heat, then cook, stirring, until the sauce has thickened and the berries have popped, 3-5 minutes. Remove the saucepan from the heat and stir in 1 cup blueberries. Set aside to cool.
- 3. Using a Microplane grater, remove 1 tsp zest from the lemon and set aside.
- 4. Beat the cream cheese in a small bowl until smooth. Add the remaining 2 tbsp sugar and the orange juice concentrate. Continue beating until smooth. Gently beat in the yogurt and lemon zest.

#### **Putting it together:**

Get out 6 martini glasses, or any other show-stopping glasses you have. Divide half of the cake cubes among the glasses. Top with about 2 tbsp blueberry sauce and about 2 tbsp cream cheese mixture. Repeat the layers once.

Make sure the remaining ½ cup blueberries are really dry. If not, roll them gently between paper towels. Garnish each glass with blueberries, dividing evenly. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour before serving.

#### <u>OR</u>

You can serve this in a trifle bowl by arranging half of the cake in the base of the bowl, then top with half the blueberry sauce and half the yogurt mixture; repeat the layers once. Garnish with remaining ½ cup berries. Cover and refrigerate for 2 hours.

#### My Notes:

I did not worry about drying the blueberries but they were frozen. The sauce didn't thicken as well as I thought it would so I wouldn't worry about it too much.

I also made double the recipe to fill up the rather large trifle bowl that I used.


