Gayle will be giving two presentations at FLC:

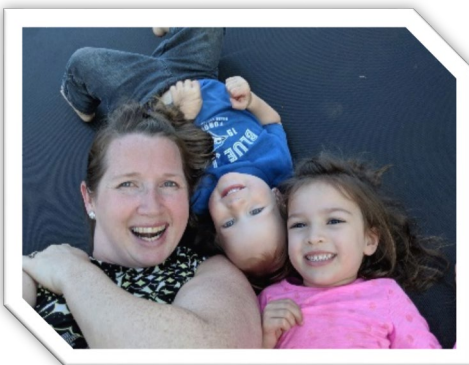
