



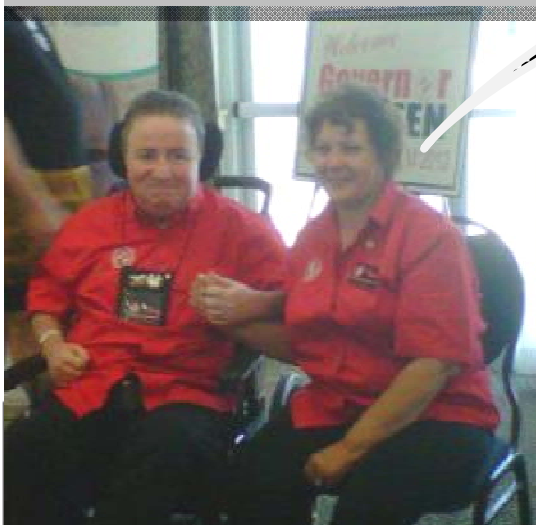

Dear District 1 Members,

Due to technical difficulties with the hardware hosting the audio file from Convention, the official minutes for District 1 Convention have been delayed. Efforts are being made to restore the file so that the official minutes can be retrieved. We ask for your patience at this time. Should the minutes become available or circumstances change, you will continue to be kept informed.

In the meantime, and in an effort to keep District 1 members up to date, we are providing a minutes "summary". This is not meant to replace the official minutes; however, it should serve to educate members on the results of the business sessions of District 1 Convention 2012, until the official minutes become available.

MINUTES –

- the minutes from Fall Leadership Conference 2011 were approved as presented

FINANCIAL –

- The financial statement from Fall Leadership Conference 2011 were approved as presented
- The 2012-2013 District 1 Cystic Fibrosis-Service Budget was approved as presented
- The 2012-2013 District 1 Budget was approved as presented

RESOLUTIONS –

- All three Vice Governors' resolutions, as presented and circulated , were approved
- Motion was made regarding implications of the proposed National Budget (Summary), which would see one (incoming) Governor and one (outgoing) Governor be out-of-pocket for their planned attendance at National Convention in Peterborough. The motion was for the non-reimbursed Convention Assessments (which totalled \$2950 for District 1 Convention 2012) to be used to offset the previously noted out-of-pocket expenses (registration, accommodations and travel), in the event that the National Budget passes as proposed. This motion was carried.

ELECTIONS –

- Chris Kekes (Cambridge-North Dumfries Kinsmen) and Melissa Suggitt (Waterloo-Grand River Kinettes) were acclaimed as Vice Governors for the 2012-2013 year.
- Bids to host District Convention 2013 were put in by the Palmerston & District Kinette Club and the Fergus & District Kinsmen Club. The Fergus & District Kinsmen Club were elected as the 2013 hosts of District 1 Convention with their theme, "Seussical" (Dr. Seuss).
- No bids to host Perc Dawson 2012-2013 were received; however after nominations, the Cambridge-North Dumfries Kinsmen Club's offer to host was gratefully accepted.

- Governors Dan Strugar and Colleen Wake presented the chains of office to Governors-elect Marty Makins (Hamilton Kinsmen) and Terri Iredale (St. Marys Kinettes)
- Governors-elect Marty Makins and Terri Iredale presented Vice Governors' pins to Chris Kekes and Melissa Suggitt

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS –

- Convention Co-coordinators Terri Iredale and Tanya Bettridge (Hartung) thanked everyone for attending, for participating in the theme and invited all attendees to return next year with more fellow members. "TnT" also acknowledged the hard work of their Committee – Monika McKean, Nancy Loughlean and Odette Houle
- Past Governor Norm McColl visited delegates Saturday morning and was officially installed into the "Past Governors' Club"
- National Presentations – National Risk Management Committee, National Membership Committee, Hal Rogers Endowment Fund, National Board of Directors, National Awards Committee and Proposed National Budget (Summary), National Convention Promotion
- National Vice President Candidates and District 1 Vice Governor Candidates participated in Candidates' Forums
- Fall Leadership Conference 2012 promotional presentation by Kitchener-Waterloo family of Kin
- Portraits of Honour presentation by Dave Sopha and Bruce Lloyd

GALAS –

- Saturday evening was the "Service in Sicily Gala", which featured a guest speaker, presentation of awards and funds raised totals
- Sunday evening was the "Godfather Governors' Ball" gala, which featured special thank-you presentations, awards and Vice Governors-Governors-Past Governors pin exchanges and presentations

PARKING LIMITATIONS:

PLEASE HELP us keep the roadways passable and our Kamp safe, by limiting the on-site vehicles to an absolute minimum. As in the past, a parking lot will be setup, in the field beside the sewage treatment plant, outside the park entrance. Due to fire and safety regulations, we can allow only a minimum number of vehicles at each Kamp site: **ALL OTHER** vehicles must use the parking lot outside the park. Please help us make more room for **KAMPERS**, not **PARKING**. As well, there are to be **NO ATV's** or **off-road vehicles** at Kin Kamp.

** Kin Kampers are also asked NOT TO PARK in the public day-use parking spots immediately below the hill.*

RESERVING SITES EARLY:

Reservations for before or after Kin Kamp can be made by phoning the Memorial Park Campground at 519-538-2530 (1-800-399-6323). I *hope* to have a copy of the Kin Kamp map layout to the park office by July 1, so that you can reserve the same sites for before or after Kin Kamp. The parks board management has asked the Kinsmen Club of Meaford to remind all Kin Kampers not to disturb other campers in the park before the actual Kin Kamp starts. The Kinsmen Club of Meaford does not have the sole use of the Kin Kamp field until 5:00 p.m. Friday August 3, 2012. Anybody having complaints filed against them by park management will be asked to leave the park with no refund of registration by either the Meaford Parks Board or the Meaford Kinsmen club.

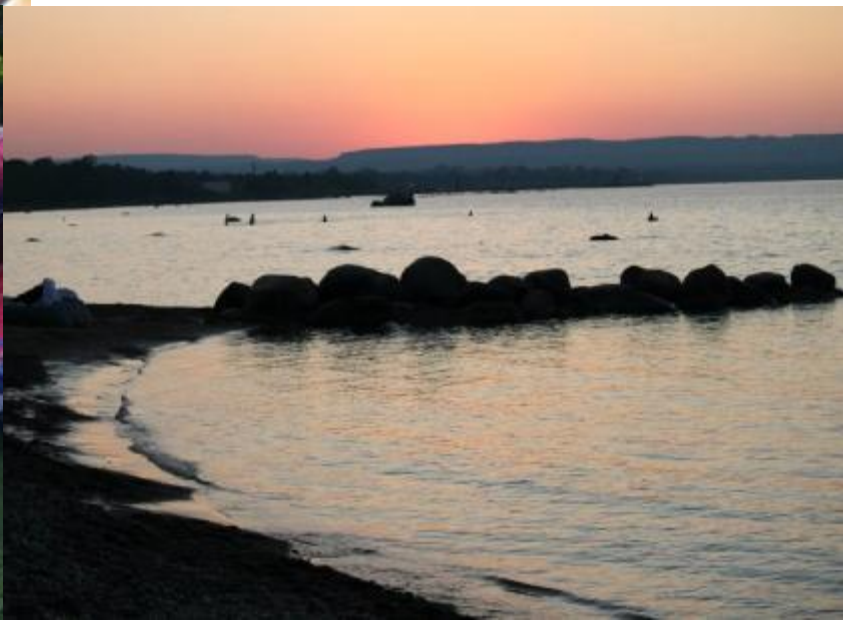

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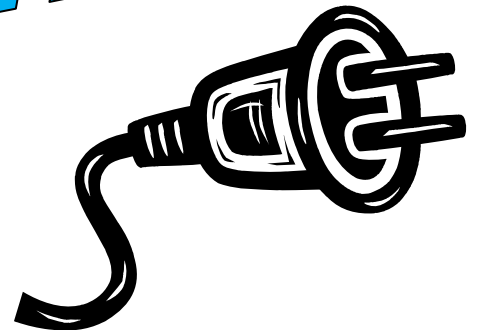

I have come to know her mother, also a member, and I think I understand where her daughter got the wonderful traits she had.

I became an official Palmerston Kinette in September, was fully installed and then made the Cystic Fibrosis Director. I love the job and it didn't matter that I had no clue what I was doing. Every member of the club has offered help in one fashion or another. We have a tremendous amount of fun at our meetings. I am learning more and more every meeting I go to. There are many more moments of outstanding things that I have witnessed Kin.

I now wonder why the heck it took me so long to join. It has been a wonderful experience so far and I know that I can only grow as a human being and volunteer. There are so many people that are willing to embrace you, and help guide you in your learning experience in the Kin community, that it truly does seem like an extension of my family. I would recommend this group of people to anyone that I meet. You should recommend it, too.
