Well enough about me,



Do you believe that we are more than half way thru our Kin year? Time flies when you are having fun with your Kin family within your community raising monies for Cystic Fibrosis, our National project and the betterment of your community.

This time of year is very important to make sure that your club is in good standing with your financial requirements. First of all, thank you to all of the clubs that have submitted their District dues. We are almost at 100% of collected dues. Secondly, all clubs were responsible to complete a financial statement of all of the Club's accounts for the preceding year ending June 30th and have the statement reviewed. Also, all clubs were responsible to complete budgets for the current year and have them approved by the club. Both the reviewed financial statements and approved budgets were to be forwarded to myself as the District Treasurer and your Zone Deputy Governor. If you have not forwarded this information, please send as soon as possible as they were due by October 31st.

Each club is responsible to complete a mini-financial review on their accounts as of December 31st, and forward to myself and your Zone Deputy Governor by January 31st. The mini-financial review is an opportunity for your club to review the club's financial position and make any corrections or adjustments that might be required prior to the end of the Kin year. This really makes preparation of your year-end statement easier.



Article 9 - ELECTION AND DUTIES OF DEPUTY GOVERNOR - Section 2 - Nominations - Sub Section 1

CURRENTLY READS:

Article 9 - Election and Duties of Deputy Governor

Section 2 - Nominations

1. At least ninety (90) days prior to the date of the Zone Conference the current District Secretary shall write to each Club in the District enclosing a nomination blank and asking for nominations for the office of Deputy Governor for the Zone for the Kin year following the Conference.

RESOLUTION:

Whereas, the above noted Section requires the District Secretary to track the dates of the various Zone Conference, and

Whereas, the nomination of a Deputy Governor is Zone business, and

Whereas, the completed form is returned to the current Deputy Governor,

Therefore be it resolved that: Article 9, Section 2 – Sub Section 1 be amended to read:

Article 9 - Election and Duties of Deputy Governor

Section 2 - Nominations

1. At least ninety (90) days prior to the date of the Zone Conference the current Deputy Governor (or in the event of no Deputy Governor, the District appointed representative) shall write to each Club in their Zone enclosing a nomination blank and asking for nominations for the office of Deputy Governor for the Zone for the Kin year following the Conference.

Intent: To move the business operations of the Zones back to the responsibility of the Deputy Governor.

Status: Ruled In Order



Article 13 - ZONE CONFERENCES - Section 6 - Voting CURRENTLY READS:

Article 13 - Zone Conference

Section 6 - Voting

Each District One Club having paid its annual dues will be entitled to votes as per the current Kin Canada General Operating By-Laws and National Policies and Procedures

RESOLUTION:

Whereas, the recently changed voting procedures requires the use of Accredited Delegate Forms at Zone Conference, and

Whereas, there is currently no direction in place for the distribution of Accredited Delegate Forms for Zone Conference, and

Whereas, the Accredited Delegate Forms for Zone Conference are part of the business operations of the zone, and

Whereas, the completed form is returned to the current Deputy Governor,

Therefore be it resolved that: Article 13, Section 6 -be amended to include a sub section which will read: Article 13 - Zone Conferences

Section 6 - Voting

Each District One Club having paid its annual dues will be entitled to votes as per the current Kin Canada General Operating By-Laws and National Policies and Procedures

1. At least sixty (60) days prior to the date of the Zone Conference the current Deputy Governor shall write to each Club in their Zone enclosing an Accredited Delegate Form.

Intent: To develop a process for the distribution of Accredited Delegate Forms for Zone Conference.

Status: Ruled In Order



Article 14 – FINANCE - Section 6 – CYSTIC FIBROSIS (CF) Service - Sub-Section #2 CURRENTLY READS:

Article 14 - FINANCE

Section 6 - CYSTIC FIBROSIS (CF) SERVICE

1. The District Governor(s) shall appoint an audit committee from the current council to include the District Treasurer and two/three additional Council members to review the CF/Service finances by March 15th following the closing of the books, for the previous Kin year, for circulation, printing and presentation at the Annual District Convention.

RESOLUTION:

Whereas, this article has not been enforced in several years, and instead an independent Kin member has reviewed the books, and

Whereas, the District financial statements are currently being reviewed by an independent Kin member,

Therefore be it resolved that: Article 14, Section 6 - Sub Section 2 be amended to read:

Article 14 - Finances

Section 6 - Cystic Fibrosis (CF) Service

2. The outgoing District CF/Service Director(s) shall provide a copy of financial statements, reviewed by an independent Kin member, to the current District Executive, in order that it may be distributed to all Clubs or printed in Kinship One, at least thirty (30) days prior to the Annual District Convention.

Intent: To bring the Cystic Fibrosis (CF) Service Financial reporting in line with the process currently in use for the District Financial reporting.

Whereas, Article 14 – Section 6 – Sub Section 2 now identifies an independent Kin member as the party responsible for reviewing the CF/Service Financials,

Therefore be it resolved that: Article 14, Section 6 – Sub Section 7 be amended to read:

Article 14 - Finances

Section 6 - Cystic Fibrosis (CF) Service

7. The outgoing District CF/Service Director(s) shall present a financial statement reviewed by an independent Kin member, of the CF/Service account at the Annual District Convention immediately following their term of office.

Intent: To bring consistency in the Cystic Fibrosis (CF) Service Financial reporting terminology.



What is a Zone Conference?

A Zone Conference is essentially the annual business meeting of your zone. Holding a Zone Conference gives clubs an opportunity to discuss matters that pertain to the operation of the zone, such as conducting zone service projects, holding Zone sporting events, changing Zone policy and reviewing and passing Zone budgets.

The Zone Conference allows members who are unable to attend a district or national convention the chance to voice their concerns to representatives who will have the opportunity to attend these conferences.

It also offers a forum for the zone speakers' competition and provides the opportunity to distribute various zone awards. It is also the venue for the election of the new Deputy Governor. Most zones hold a joint meeting that both Kinsmen and Kinettes attend but can also include time on the agenda for both groups to meet separately. Each separate meeting would be chaired by the respective Deputy Governor.

Kin Rules of Order should be in effect, and members should be encouraged to stand and be recognized by the chair before speaking on matters.

If you are Club President you will be asked by the Deputy Governor to submit prior to the Zone Conference a President's Report that would be published in the Zone Conference Brochure. If one is not complied you should be prepared to give a verbal report from your Club at the Zone Conference.

Be aware of the theme of the Zone Conference and be prepared as a club to participate in the fun that this creates.

Awards will be subject to your Zone Bylaws, District and National Awards program. Ensure you are aware of them and promote participation.

Remember that you **MUST** fill out the Zone Conference Accredited Delegate Form prior to the Zone Conference and file with the Deputy Governor 7 days before the Conference. All voting procedures follow our National Policies and Procedures.



I want Kin to Be Unstoppable!



Everyone joining together to serve our communities greatest need.


