This is the National Award Criteria which is to be followed at all levels of the competition. Remember that your bulletin must be submitted to your Deputy Governor for making at zone level for awards purposes. Winning bulletins at zone level will be forwarded to Bill and Monika for marking at District level. Winning District One bulletins will be forwarded to National for the National Award marking.

PURPOSE:

To provide a guideline for clubs to follow to produce an effective means of club communication and to recognize the effort of the bulletin editor and club for an outstanding publication.

DIVISION OF AWARDS:

- Kinsmen Ritchie Senior clubs of 15 or more members
- Kinsmen Ritchie Junior clubs of 14 and less members
- Dawn Freeland Kinette Senior Bulletin Award clubs of 15 or more members
- Kaye Turner Kinette Junior bulletin Award clubs of 14 and less members

Membership taken as of October 31st of the Kin year they are judged and that it be based on the "official" membership in the club as defined in the National By-Laws.

SUBMISSION OF ENTRIES:

- 1. Entries shall only be the winning bulletins for each division from each district in the Association for that year.
- 2. All entries shall be submitted to national headquarters within 10 days of the close of the spring district convention or by June 30th, whichever comes first.
- 3. Entries must contain four sets of five issues. Each set must contain the same issues.
- 4. All entries shall become the property of the association and as such will not be returned to the club.
- 5. Electronic versions of bulletins must be provided in printed format.

JUDGING:

- 1. Entries shall be judged by a national committee of judges named by the national awards committee.
- 2. Entries shall be judged according to material and appearance. The mandatory requirements and maximum allowable points for the various items to be considered shall be as outline below.
- 3. All entrants shall receive a written critique within 60 days of National Convention.
- 4. The committees shall determine a winner and a runner-up for each award.

JUDGING CRITERIA:

A. Mandatory Requirements (each issue)

- 1. Outside front cover, inside front cover or first immediate page following:
 - a) club name, zone and district
 - b) names of club president and bulletin editor
 - c) club contact information
 - d) date, time and place of meeting
 - e) issue number of bulletin
- 2. Minutes of last general meeting
- 3. President's report
- 4. Calendar of events

B. Content

1. Club Activities

a) activities of club members, birthdays, etc.	5 points
b) reports on social events	5 points
c) reports/updates on service projects	5 points
d) articles submitted by club members (other than bulletin editor)	5 points
e) Kin profiles / Kin Kid section	5 points

2. Editorials (5 points each to a maximum of 10)

National Convention Report

2008-2009 District One Council **Making Dreams Come True**

National Convention was held in Lethbridge, Alberta this year. The Lethbridge Kin family did an outstanding job and everything ran smoothly. The hospitality was superb and the extra tours around Lethbridge fantastic. Alberta truly is a beautiful part of our country but there is still no place like home.

District One was well represented at convention with 24 members in attendance and numerous proxies. Thank-you to all who took the time to fill out the proxies as they are an integral part of convention, without them the voice of District One would go unheard.

One issue was on the floor in new business and pertained to the notice of motion on amending section 5.01 that would have required the use of poll votes for all motions that had been duly circulated and all motions dealing with budgets, at District and National conventions. A straw vote indicated that approximately 75% of the floor was against the motion, but a poll vote was called to clarify the outcome. The results were similar and the motion was defeated. It was noted that the poll vote took 25 minutes to do and much longer to tabulate, so therefore did not save the time it was reported to in the presentation of the motion.

The budget is always of great interest, as most of you may have gathered from our own Spring Convention. There was one amendment to the budget which increased the dues assessment by \$1.00. This was to add back in the levy for media relations as the floor felt that it was important to continue to promote Kin across the country. Total dues for National are \$144.87.

Kin Sean Thompson of the Kinsmen Club of Gananoque was elected National Vice President. Kin Doug Robinson of the Kinsmen Club of Orangeville assumed the role of National President.

At the town hall meeting segment of convention one of the controversial subjects that were talked about was the need for criminal checks to be performed on our membership and prospective members. The National Board was seeking input from the membership on ways to proceed. There was some heated discussion on the many impacts it will have to current and future members.

Nationally the total service dollars reported at \$15,192,752.69 which includes the national donation to CF research of \$890,114. National Highlights included 4 new charters including the first ever Campus Club, District 4 had the only positive membership growth, 52 students

received Kin Canada Bursaries, and 32 members were made Life members of the Association.

On Thursday we had two very interesting keynote speakers. Tim Ferguson gave a presentation on *Reaching Your Target Market*. Tim is an outside consultant brought in to help us improve our communication with potential members. He was a dynamic speaker and really had all of us surging with enthusiasm. David Irvine was the speaker for the afternoon and he spoke on building a culture that attracts and keeps great people. David is one of Canada's most respected voices on leadership and personal development and he was also a Kin Kid. He has written may books on "being real". Workshops were held after each presentation with the speakers presiding over two of the six workshops. A few of the key ideas in the speakers' presentations were;

- how to organize our communication strategy more effectively
- "If we let you in, will I still belong?" (a thought that creates anxiety in some of the seasoned members of a club when a prospective member or a member from another club transfers in)
- The need to acknowledge those people that have given each of us a hand along the way. In all of our lives, there is that person or persons who has given us a helping hand, been a mentor to us, or has had some profound impact on our lives. Too often we do not acknowledge these people and just accept what has been given. Take the time to acknowledge those people and call them, or send them a note.
- We need to balance passion and experience. Clubs need to embrace change, but before you can successfully change, you must first have stability. Never diminish the value of our roots, for we must honour our past. But we should inventory what we can let go, so we can move forward.

The whole day was very inspirational and everyone left pumped with enthusiasm to go out there and promote what being KIN really means.

The opening ceremonies were held at Camp Whoop-up with a cannon firing to start us off and native dancers later in the evening. Some of the other festivities were a western BBQ and a trip through a corn maze, an interesting acapella band Hoja who travelled from Saskatchewan and played for free at the service dinner, and tours of southern Alberta's attractions.

Next year's National Convention committee outdid themselves with an exceptional presentation. Remember to mark your calendars for next year August 26-29, 2009, in Niagara Falls. District One, you can't say it is too far to go. It promises to be one of the best National Conventions yet, talk to any of the committee members and find out what they have in store for us. Book now to avoid disappointment and encourage your fellow members to share in the experience.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM RISK MANAGER BILL AND NATIONAL HEADQUARTERS

(a follow up to information in Kinship One)



IMPORTANT ADVISORY TO ALL CLUBS Moratorium on all Texas Hold'em and Poker Events



There continues to be a tremendous amount of discussion on the subject of Texas Hold'em events – so much so that it prompted a new National enforcement policy on illegal activities and an explanatory article in the February 15 edition of Kin-nections.

It is a great concern that some clubs have persisted in trying to find 'loopholes' and event scenarios that could possibly pass as being legal, ignoring advice from National to avoid these events for now. When clubs begin to place their own wishes above those of other clubs, individual members and the Association as a whole, it puts us all at risk. That's simply not acceptable.

The situation has been especially difficult in Ontario, where regulations are ambiguous and enforcement inconsistent. In February, 2007, National Risk Management Coordinator Melanie Nieson again confirmed with the OPP's Barrie Illegal Gaming Crime Unit that trying to ensure that such events are legal by simply avoiding the five basic 'rules of thumb' is not sufficient. There are numerous other complications that would render the event illegal, some of which may be very difficult to control and which can even happen while the event is in-progress.

The OPP Constable's message was very clear: There are so many variables that he cannot guarantee that a club would not be charged with running an illegal gambling event, even after precautionary measures. He therefore recommends against any of our clubs holding any form of Texas Hold'em or other poker-based events for which licences are not available.

As a further complication, insurance coverages would be denied if the event is found by authorities to be illegal. This therefore makes these events a high risk guessing game, and essentially the same as going into an event without insurance.

In light of this latest information and the continued arguing by some, we are left with no choice but to take discretion and interpretation out of the picture. Effective immediately and until further notice, National is placing a moratorium on all Texas Hold'em and other poker events as club activities. They are not to be undertaken, except where expressly allowed by provincial legislation and the required permits and/or documented permissions have been obtained from the proper authorities.

Any club that contravenes this policy will be subject to severe disciplinary action. The club will immediately be placed Not in Good Standing and the process for revoking their charter will be commenced. For the protection of all Kin, this isn't something we can fool around with.

I appreciate that these are relatively easy events to hold in relation to the amount of funds that can be raised, and truly regret that this may impact the plans of some clubs. This is why a great deal of grace has been extended on this subject until clubs became more familiar with the requirements. However, National must adhere to National Ends Policy 2(h), intended to ensure that all clubs and the Association operate in a legal manner at all times.

National staff are continuing to press provincial authorities for much clearer guidelines that would allow these events to happen legally and with certainty; and ideally to follow the lead of Newfoundland-Labrador and Manitoba in allowing certain exceptions for non-profits. We will advise clubs if the situation changes. For now, we have to work within the system as it exists and ask for your cooperation.
